## One Family At A Time

amilies of all backgrounds, speaking languages from across the globe, stream through our doors. For many, our Library means free access to the Internet and the online world of information. In fact, in 2016 we provided **more than 92,000 online sessions**.

Last year the Ossie Davis Theater was booked to capacity and thanks to the Friends of the New Rochelle Public Library, we offered more than **1,000 free cultural programs**. **224 adults received one-on-one tutoring** for high school equivalency diplomas and **230 people received individual career counseling**. Last year, **more than 1,000 tax returns were prepared** (at no charge) by trained AARP volunteers. The Library touches families in so many ways. The numbers are astounding. But the individual stories are even better.

"Rosemary and Karina discovered me.
Rosemary's Mom used to register her for all our workshops. Soon I was asking her to help me run our children's programs.
Karina found me the same way. Her family moved to the neighborhood and her Mom discovered our Spanish language collection and our free programming. By the time Karina was in high school, she was one of my best craft instructors. Rosemary and Karina were not just volunteers. They were teenage Library ambassadors. These young women are our pride and joy. They are what the Library is all about."
